

Hundreds of people in all departments across the Hinckley site and the Leicester contact centre took part in the five fun days.

The dress down day was very popular, with people wearing what they liked for a £1.

And, local companies near both sites generously donated prizes for a raffle.

Despite all the fun and games, both sites ensured that it was business as usual for the national energy network supplier.

Liz Roberts, a National Grid co-ordinator, said: "We have a fantastic relationship with Macmillan, a charity close to the hearts of our staff across Leicestershire. We went all out to raise as much as possible for this worthwhile cause. And we did!

"It's been a brilliant team effort and we'd like to thank everyone who contributed. We're very proud of how we've made a positive difference to those coping with cancer."

The money raised by this week's efforts will go towards the general support of cancer patients and their families.

The strong bond between National Grid and Macmillan, cemented by a two-year partnership during 2014 and 2015, was to raise money to support people living with cancer and their families.

Over those two years, with National Grid agreeing to match every penny raised by their caring staff, £600,000 was donated.

The money was used to pay for more than 3,100 emergency fuel grants to help cancer patients struggling to heat their homes.

There are currently 2.5 million people living with cancer and by 2020 almost one in two people will get cancer at some point in their lives.

Macmillan improves the lives of people affected by cancer by providing practical, medical and financial support.

## Notes to Editors:

National Grid is pivotal to the energy systems in the UK and the north eastern United States. We aim to serve customers well and efficiently, supporting the communities in which we operate and making possible the energy systems of the future.

## National Grid in the UK:

- We own and operate the electricity transmission network in England and Wales, with day-to-day responsibility for balancing supply and demand. We also operate, but do not own, the Scottish networks. Our networks comprise approximately 7,200 kilometres (4,474 miles) of overhead line, 1,500 kilometres (932 miles) of underground cable and 342 substations.
- We own and operate the gas National Transmission System in Great Britain, with day-to-day responsibility for balancing supply and demand. Our network comprises approximately 7,660 kilometres (4,760 miles) of high-pressure pipe and 618 above-ground installations.
- As Great Britain's System Operator (SO) we make sure gas and electricity is transported safely and efficiently from where it is produced to where it is consumed. From April 2019, Electricity System Operator (ESO) is a new standalone business within National Grid, legally separate from all other

parts of the National Grid Group. This will provide the right environment to deliver a balanced and impartial ESO that can realise real benefits for consumers as we transition to a more decentralised, decarbonised electricity system.

• Other UK activities mainly relate to businesses operating in competitive markets outside of our core regulated businesses; including interconnectors, gas metering activities and a liquefied natural gas (LNG) importation terminal – all of which are now part of National Grid Ventures. National Grid Property is responsible for the management, clean-up and disposal of surplus sites in the UK. Most of these are former gas works.
